





Directions


1. Open the VidBox Application on the desktop by double clicking the icon




2. Click Video



3. Click RCA Composite - one highlighted in the Image - press the arrow button (indicating next)




4. Set up your designated recording time - Reminder: it is only a 2.5 hour session and the film is in real time - Click the arrows button (indicating next)




Recording

- Enter the video file name.
- Select the video aspect ratio. a. If you are converting VHS tapes, it should be in 4:3 format. b. Select the Widescreen (16:9) option if your video appears squished or compressed in the Preview Screen. Generally, this will only be necessary for camcorder DV tapes recorded in the 16x9 format.
- Begin playback of your video tape to view it in the Preview Screen.
- Click the [Record] button to start recording. Click the [Stop] button to manually stop the recording any time.
- Once finished, click the arrow pointing to the right to proceed.



Click “Convert to MP4” to watch on mobile device or computer



- Choose a resolution setting and video quality setting. Choosing higher resolution and video quality will result in larger file size.
- Click on “Save” the button to begin.
